Nanaimo Forklift License - In North America, acquiring forklift certification or a forklift license involves hands-on and classroom training. Regulatory control over licensing, certification and training for powered industrial truck operators falls under the jurisdiction of state, provincial and federal groups. Operators may acquire a license either through training administered by the employer or by a third party. In any case, regulatory requirements need to be met. Recertification is necessary every two to three years.

Lift trucks are powered industrial trucks which come along with a variety of alternatives, like stand-up and sit-down. There are different sizes and types of forklift suitable for different industrial uses. Operator training courses are usually individualized to be able deal with the specific uses and kinds for which the operator is training. Training on a gas-powered, sit-down lift truck inside a warehouse setting will not be the same as training on a propane-powered, stand-up lift truck within a shipyard. The various forklifts and their uses makes it impossible to establish universal licensing requirements for all equipment and industries. Regulatory standards, thus, have a tendency not to focus on particular course requirements but rather on the outcome of individual training programs.

On the job training which is offered by the employer is the most common method of forklift training licensing and certification. The employer who offers this method of certification is required to offer classroom sessions and practical training on machinery at their place of work. Employers may choose to train employees on every kind of forklift separately, or to train them on all machines combined. The program incorporates lift truck operation methods, forklift maintenance, safety measures and company policies. Topics particular to the worksite, like for instance dangerous materials or conditions, must be included. Following classroom learning, operators are taught how to safely operate and use each type of forklift on the worksite.

Certification through a third-party vendor usually requires an on-site component along with hands-on practice.

It must be noted that employer-provided certifications do not transfer from one employer to the next. Receiving a lift truck license through employer-provided training enables the operator to run a lift truck for that employer only.

The most significant factor of lift truck license training is forklift safety. The exact safety training requirements differ from one type of equipment to another. Safety issues differ from industry to industry and from employer to employer. Both third-party providers and employer-provided training might have to address additional requirements for safety training in applicable businesses, like for instance in marine and offshore operations.
